Ukraine Ministry Outreach

Dear Partners and friends,

When you receive this newsletter I will have already left home for ministry in Ukraine. I begin teaching upon the day of my arrival into the Crimea area. I will finish up this three-month intensive training school with the graduation of the students enrolled in this 20th school of ministry. I will do a three-day crusade March 17-19, then travel 8 to 10 hours either by car or train to the Dontesk area where I will teach in school number twenty-one another seven days.

In addition to teaching each day I will do another evangelistic gospel crusade and March 24-25.

We truly need and appreciate your prayers. Please pray for God's protection, anointing, health, provisions, and daily strength for this demanding schedule of meetings and ministry. Pray we will see a mighty harvest of souls. I will be sharing the report of this outreach in our next newsletter.

INDIA MINISTRY REPORT

Part Two

SUNDAY - We had two wonderful services in Hyderabad—one at the church near where Moses lives, the other at the Bible school. Pastor Boyd and Ken did the early service and I ministered in the 11:00 a.m. service held at the Bible school. This church at the Bible school has been operating less than a year and already more than one hundred people are attending the service. The Lord blessed with a wonderful response to the altar call.

MONDAY - We had an early departure from Hyderabad to Mumbai and about three hours waiting for our next flight to Calicut. James, the director, and Saji the principal of our Malabar Theological College were waiting for us to bring us to the campus where we would begin another busy schedule of meetings.

We each took turns teaching in the Bible school on Tuesday. Then, Wednesday through Friday we had over one hundred fifty pastors come to the campus for the Pastors Power Conference. This was our third Pastors conference and in each we witnessed a deep hungry for the teaching of God's Word.

Saturday was a glorious day! We began our graduation service at 9:00 a.m. as more than nine hundred fifty people came to the campus to share in the graduation of our students. We had twenty young men graduate. After three years of training we presented each a very good study Bible with other books to take with them as they go into different areas of the country evangelizing and planting new churches.

Three of our graduates are from Nepal. Two have returned and the third will work in our school for one year as he pursues further studies from a university in Cochin, then he will return. One of these three actually graduated last year but came back this year for the bi-annual graduation to receive his degree. Last year he had sixteen believers in his new church (mostly members of his family) but now one year later he reported having over 63 believers.

The country of Nepal for years has been a totally Hindu nation and very resistant to the Gospel. However, the landscape is changing! They are opening up and al-

lowing Christian workers to come in. Pastor James, our director will be visiting Nepal during the school break in April to see how we can best train and deploy young ministers from South India to minister in this area. Pray the Lord will give him special favor and open doors.

Following the graduation at 1:30 p.m. we had a quick lunch and drove one hour to one of our elementary schools where we conducted a medical camp. We were able to secure two Christian doctors, a nurse, and two medical helpers from an area hospital. They treated 125 patients, mostly Muslim women and children. The medical camps give us the opportunity to show the love of Christ to these precious souls. Pray the Holy Spirit will remove the darkness and open their eyes of understanding to the Lord Jesus Christ.

It was a long day as we were late getting back to our rooms. To say the least, everybody was very tired, but blessed and excited about all the Lord had done this day.

Sunday we went to another elementary school where the lower floor is now completed and open with an auditorium that will seat a couple hundred people (Indian style). Fifteen of our graduates who have churches in surrounding areas of this school brought as many of their congregations as possible for ONE UNITED COMMON WORSHIP SERVICE. The communion service with these combined congregations was beautiful and very inspiring. While I was preaching on the subject "The Yokes of Satan versus the Yoke of Jesus", a demon possessed woman began convulsing. Those demons were cast out and the woman testified that she had been tormented by these demons for the past five years. When I commanded her to open

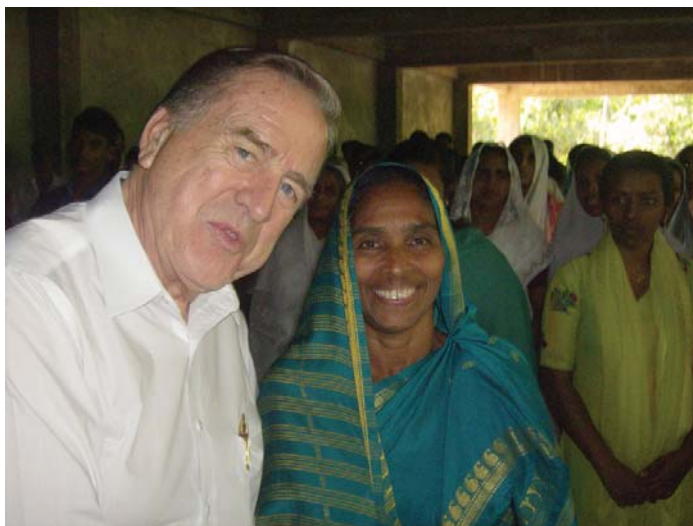

Following her deliverance her eyes were beautiful and bright as the picture I'm sharing will show. Praise God, Jesus is still the deliverer because He is the same yesterday, today and forever! (Heb. 13:8). Her deliverance was an actual demonstration of my message. It moved

people and many filled the altar area seeking salvation, healing, and deliverance. TO GOD BE THE GLORY!

We returned to the campus for the afternoon medical camp. This was a glorious medical camp. We were able to have five doctors and ten nurses serve in this event. We had four specialists---a gynecologist, optometrist, bone specialist, pediatrician, and a general practitioner. They came to us from the Catholic hospital. Three of the nurses were nuns. Two nurses took a blood sample of each patient and we now have the record of each one's blood type in our offices at the school. In the event that one of these patients needed blood but needed to know their blood type they can secure that information from our office on campus.

There were two hundred and seventy people treated by this medical team, most of whom were either Muslim or Hindu people. While the people waited their turn to see a doctor we were showing Christian films for them to see. We know the seed of the Gospel was planted and these hurting people witnessed again the love of Christians for them. We know God's Word will not return void. It will accomplish what it was sent to do and I know many will come to receive the Lord Jesus Christ as their personal Savior.

This ministry outreach was very fruitful! Only
